The initiative to publish this work in the Position Papers series indicates that the EMB recognizes the importance of the seabed in the world prehistory and European cultural heritage and adopts the archaeological sub-field in its priorities of research and funding.

RESEARCH PROGRAMMES (DIRECTION)

Palaeolithic Lesbos (2012–today). The programme aims to examine the role of the Aegean Basin in early hominin dispersals in Eurasia through the discovery and interpretation of the Palaeolithic archaeology of Lesbos. It focuses on the Middle Pleistocene site of Rodafnidia-Lisvori, the first extensive Acheulean site of southeast Europe. It comprises work in the field, excavation, surface survey, geophysical and geoarchaeological prospection, and the lab, absolute dating by means of TCN, Magnetostratigraphy and OSL. The hominin activity was situated on the banks of small streams not far from the shore of the Kalloni Basin in a volcanic setting furnished with outcrops of ignimbrite, thermal springs and rocks of pyroclastic and hydrothermal origin. The Lower Palaeolithic archaeology of Lesbos has comparanda with other early material from Africa, Israel and Anatolia. It contributes to placing Greece in the discussion about human origins and the ‘Out of Africa’ and ‘Out of Asia’ dispersals. The programme is conducted by an international group of specialists including archaeologists, geologists, geophysicists and archaeometrists. It also has a public archaeology component as it works closely with the local community to engage it with the Palaeolithic past, a past that is not national but global and challenges the biblical version of creation. It is part of the University of Crete’s educational mission to train archaeology students in field methods. It is funded by the University of Crete, Wenner-Gren Foundation for Anthropological Research, Municipality of Lesbos, Regional Authority of the North Aegean, Secretariat of the Aegean and Island Affairs and Ioannis F. Kostopoulos Foundation.

The Palaeolithic archaeology of the Inner Ionian Archipelago (2010–today). The programme examines the Neanderthal settlement on Lefkas, Meganisi and the smaller islands and islets of the central Ionian Sea. It consists of five components: a. intensive surface survey, b. excavation of Panthera Cave on Kythros islet (Middle Palaeolithic), c. seabed mapping to reconstruct the submerged terrestrial landscapes around the islands and the coastlines during the major low sea level stands since MIS 8, d. date the Middle Palaeolithic settlement by means of absolute methods, e. comparative study of

the Palaeolithic material that is unveiled by the Ministry of Culture activity on Lefkas. In the semi-enclosed and well protected inner sea where there is good visibility of the island destinations and small distances to be crossed in order to reach them, the programme also explores the early history of sea crossings. It is part of the University of Crete's educational mission to train archaeology students in field methods. Beyond fieldwork, part of the training takes place in the Department of History and Archaeology laboratory at the Rethymno campus where the archaeological finds are stored. Neolithic Katsambas: The Alexiou excavations (2004–today). The programme aims to study and prepare the final publication of the Neolithic finds recovered from the settlement and the mortuary cave excavated by Stylianos Alexiou at Katsambas in the 1950s. The project has been funded by the Institute for Aegean Prehistory (New York) and the University of Crete.

Human presence during the Palaeolithic in the Kastoria Lake Basin: The evidence from the Pantazopoulos collection (2006–2008). The objective of the programme was to study and publish this collection of knapped stone that pushes the history of human occupation in west Macedonia to the Middle Palaeolithic times. It was funded by the Institute for Aegean Prehistory (New York).

The ethnoarchaeology of food-gathering. A study of the patterns of collection, storage and consumption of land snails in Crete (2006). An ethnoarchaeological project that aims to record and publish the traditional practices relating to land snails that are part of the modern Cretan cuisine. It was funded by the University of Crete Research Committee.

The Middle Palaeolithic settlement of Lefkas (1998–2000). The objective of the programme was to study comparatively, date and publish the lithic finds recovered from Middle Palaeolithic open-air sites in Lefkas. It was funded by the MacDonal Institute for Archaeological Research of the University of Cambridge.

Palaeolithic Kastritsa (1996–1998). Kastritsa is a small cleft in the homonymous limestone hill on the Pamvotis lakeshore at Ioannina. The site had been excavated in the 1960's by E. Higgs yielding a rich Upper Palaeolithic sequence that was partially published. The project's objective was to: a. AMS date the archaeological sequence using samples that had been originally collected by the excavator and b. study the chaine opératoire for tool knapping employing refitting. It was funded by the British Federation of Women Graduates (London) and the Institute for Aegean Prehistory (New York).

RESEARCH PROGRAMMES (CO-DIRECTION)

Public Archaeology: Developing innovative methods to teach it - Innovarch (2015–2017). A three-year partly educational and partly research programme aiming to record Public Archaeology practices in four European countries and develop new

undergraduate and graduate curricula to teach this academic field. The Autonomous University of Barcelona (Paloma González Marcén) lead the programme, and the Linneaus University, Kalmar (Cornelius Holtorf) and the University of Warsaw (Roksana Chowaneic) were also partners. Through this collaboration we put under our magnifying lens the different academic traditions on the subject. 39 UoC students, three staff members, and two graduates participated in seminars and fieldtrips in museums, sites and monuments of Catalunya, Poland, south Sweden, and Crete. RESEARCH PROGRAMMES (PARTICIPATION)

Continental Shelf Prehistoric Research (2009–today). In this emerging sub-field of prehistory, stone age archaeologists and marine geologists join forces to: a. identify the early submerged archaeological record that lies under water and b. obtain a holistic view of the Pleistocene geography that includes landscapes on land and below water. The Palaeolithic research I have been conducting on the islands of the Aegean and the Ionian Seas brought me into the subject. My involvement began with my participation in the SPLASHCOS (2009-2013) network, continued with my collaboration with the Hellenic National Center of Marine Research to map the central Ionian seabed, and was solidified with my commissioning to the writing team of *Land Beneath the Waves* and the editorial team of *Sea of Plenty*. Since 2017 I am a member of the EMODNET Geology group - Submerged Landscapes (workgroup 8). This is a European Commission initiative to homogenize the geological, bathymetric and archaeological data of the European seabed for the production of maps of the European seas. The maps will provide a unified record and aid future planning and the protection of natural and cultural resources in any future activities in the seas (commercial or otherwise). Workgroup 8 treats the seabed as a natural and cultural resource that ought to be studied and protected. The prehistoric settlement of the Kokytos River Valley (2008–2014). Embedded within the Thesprotia Expedition, a project led by the University of Helsinki and the Finnish School at Athens, my group addressed the prehistoric settlement of the area through the study of artifacts of knapped stone recovered during the survey. The UoC group consisted of two PhD candidates (S. Ligkovanlis and C. Papoulia) and an MA student (S. Doulkeridou) who under my guidance undertook the study and publication of the lithics recovered from various sites dating from the Middle Palaeolithic to the Bronze Age. In parallel, in collaboration with prof. B. Forsén, the project director, who is a classical archaeologist we collected and evaluated the evidence for the history of prehistoric occupation, assessed the surveying and data recording methodology employed and co-authored a synthesis of the history of settlement. All this work is included in the third (co-edited) volume of Thesprotia Expedition, whose largest part addresses the prehistoric sites. Funding: University of Helsinki.

Prehistoric settlement of the Istria peninsula, Croatia (1996-2004). This University of Cambridge archaeology project employs excavation and surface survey in the karstic terrain of Istria in order to study the human adaptation and settlement from the

Palaeolithic to the Bronze Age. One of the project's objectives was the training of archaeology students in field methods. During the 2001 excavation season, two students from the University of Crete participated to the project. It is funded by the National Geographic Society, the British Academy, the MacDonald Institute for Archaeological Research of the University of Cambridge.

Corpus of ancient fauna and flora of Crete (1999–2000). The project's objective was to set up a database containing the information on the natural heritage of the central and eastern Mediterranean from antiquity to modern times. The scientific team was assembled by prof. M. Mylonas, director of the Natural History Museum, University of Crete in the framework of the ARCHI-MED.
